The winners of Dr Homi J Bhabha awards for research in applied sciences and Dr L K Doraiswamy of the National Chemical Laboratory, Pune for 1977 and Prof E C Subba Rao of the Indian Institute of Technology, Kanpur for 1978.

For the Dr Meghnad Saha award for research in theoretical sciences, Dr M K Vainu Bappu of the Indian Institute of Astrophysics, Bangalore, has been selected for 1977 and Prof M S Narasimhan of the TIFR, Bombay for 1978.
